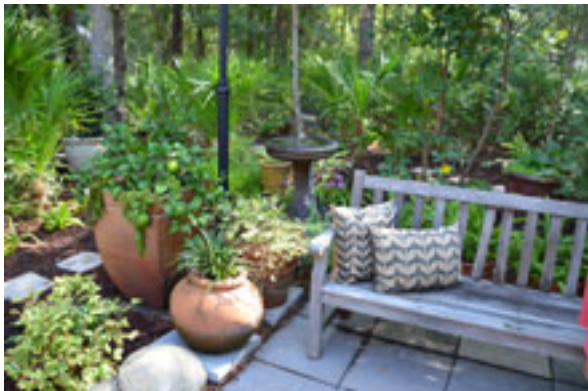




In observance of the COVID-19 pandemic and for the safety and well being of everyone involved with the Garden Tour, the **2020 All Saints Garden Tour (ASGT)** has been cancelled. It is with great sadness that this decision was made, primarily because of the impact on our grant recipients who will be in greater need than ever.

To help our charities that were anticipating monies from the tour, we have established a fund to accept donations. The ASGT Board identified Backpack Buddies of Bluffton, Backpack Buddies of Hilton Head Island, Jasper County Backpack Buddies, Hilton Head Island Safe Harbour, St. Stephens United Methodist Church Outreach Foodbank, and Family Promise to be our 2020 grant recipients. All donations will be divided equally among these six grant recipients which are all 501c3 organizations that deal with the issues of hunger, homelessness, aging, or literacy.
